I read an article this week about churches that either change or they will die. In fact, the prediction is that nearly one out of three churches will die in the next few years. You read that correctly. In fact, if churches don't make substantive changes in the next few years, your church may die.

Some of the reasons given for the death of churches are the following: We may have shallow roots or churches no longer rooted in Scripture. They have drifted to secular or social approach ministry. We may have a country club church where people demand to be served. After all they pay their dues for their perks and privileges. Maybe the church is negatively critical. Some people spend more time criticizing and less time evangelizing. They're in regular conflict. Some run off pastors or wear out pastors and staff and chase off good church members. Some churches don't want change because that's the way they've always done it. And some churches have no new Christians because existing members no longer share the Gospel.

Our church is alive and well because we do preach from the Bible. We give unconditionally. We practice evangelism and positivity. We welcome change and we share the Gospel because we celebrated the confirmation of two young people this month, I thought it would be fun to print my confirmation picture from about 65 years ago and you can see that there are three people who were confirmed and are still faithful to this church. We can thank the Lord that he has seen us through many changes, but our church will remain in the same place in Anthon and we will continue to teach our young people about the church and our Lord Jesus and welcome them into membership.

### **July Mission Projects**


