Overall, we have grown in so many areas. One of the areas that I have been most proud of this year is the many mission projects we worked on which have proven our service to others.

A few weeks ago, the announcement was made that the warming shelter in Sioux City would be closing. On the coldest night last year, they were able to provide shelter for 150 people. As money gets tighter and tighter, this is one homeless shelter that could not survive their three quarters of a million-dollar budget. There isn't anything fancy about the warming shelter, just a big building with tables and chairs where people can get out of the cold. And it's not just adults, but sometimes entire families with children. We have donated blankets and money as part of our mission giving.

Fall is here and before long; the cold and snow will arrive and homeless people will be on the streets trying to find shelter. The good news is that the city is working to keep the warming shelter open. Donations have been received and the warming shelter may be able to stay open. As the temperature dips and you reach for your furnace button, remember those who do not have a home and live on the streets. The church is not a building. The church is not a steeple. The church is a people who are here to serve others.

That pile of extra blankets you have in the closet, the extra coats you've been collecting over the years can go a long way in keeping people warm. Gather them up and find a place to help and serve people, places like the Gospel Mission or the warming shelter. All who follow Jesus all around the world...yes, we're the church together.

New Business: Officers set up for committees. Lights behind cross needs new piece.

Spring Rummage: Need more time to get things ready; not having with City-wide cleanup.

Next Meeting October 14th. Mark will do devotions. Meeting ended with a prayer by Lay Pastor Shirley.
