This past week began the 40 day journey leading up to Easter. Tuesday, before Ash Wednesday began the last big party in New Orleans to celebrate Fat Tuesday at Mardi Gras. It was started a long time ago to remind us to take time and celebrate the goodness of God. People celebrated Fat Tuesday by eating richer, fatty foods before beginning their time of fasting during Lent. Some would say it was as time for Good Christians to get all of their sinning out of the way before Lent so they would have something to give up during Lent.

The 40-day Journey was for Christ to begin his ministry with a 40 day walk in the desert which he prayed and fasted to prepare himself. It was a time of contemplation, reflection, and preparation. Many people choose to join Jesus on this journey. We don't choose to go off into the desert but we do sacrifice something so we can reflect on Christ's sacrifice and prepare for the night we remember His death and prepare for the celebration of Easter.

The Jewish society of the Old Testament during Jesus' time relied very heavily on wood fires for heating and cooking which meant keeping ashes under control was a monumental task. If a person was preoccupied, they didn't always tend to the housekeeping. If there was a death in the family, ashes were the least of their concerns. A friend stopping by might gently say, "Do you know you have ashes on your face. So ashes became a sign of mourning.

It became a common practice during this time to put ashes on their foreheads. Ashes symbolize our own grief, our own fears, our own penitence and turning wholeheartedly toward the Lord.

Today on Ash Wednesday we wear the sign of the cross on our foreheads. Ashes made of last year's palm branches are placed on our heads hearing the ancient words, "From dust you come to dust you shall return".


