It's always a good feeling to honor our senior citizens for special occasions. The week before Easter, we made up and delivered 13 Easter baskets to our nursing home and shut in residents. The Easter baskets delivered to our shut ins contained cookies, candy, hand lotion, liquid soap, snacks, puzzle books, and other useful articles. The week of Easter we celebrated Bettina Perkins 95th birthday and Marvin Hanson's 101st birthday.

We had a very special Holy Week this year. On Maundy Thursday a table full of faithful followers gathered to eat a Seder Supper together. Kathy Hodgdon led us through the meaning of the Passover supper and we ate the same food that was served more than 2000 years ago.

On Good Friday night we participated in a Tennebrea service, reading through all the scripture that led up to the crucifixion, listening to music and praying. And then we left the church in total quietness and darkness.

And Sunday morning, we celebrated the resurrection of our Lord and Savior. He had Risen. Easter traditionally lasts 40 days to commemorate the time the resurrected Jesus remained on earth before his Ascension and in some western churches, Eastertide lasts 50 days to conclude on the day of Pentecost.

For the next four weeks, we will walk through the time after the resurrection where Jesus met with his disciples and spent his last 40 days on earth. His first meeting was with his disciples appearing to them in a locked room. When Jesus greeted his disciples, He said "Peace I leave with you. Peace I give to you. Do not let your hearts be troubled. Do not be afraid".

Easter is a very special time in the religious calendar. The word "Easter" does not appear in the Bible and no early church celebrations of Christ's resurrection are mentioned in Scripture. Easter, like Christmas, is a tradition that developed later in church history.

Easter and Christmas are two religious holidays that we tell and retell every year. They cover the birth and death of Jesus. We need to continue to repeat these stories. We need to celebrate the birth of Christ and we need to celebrate the resurrection of Christ following his crucifixion. Jesus said "Peace I leave with you. Peace I give to you. Do not let your hearts be troubled. Do not be afraid". Believe and have faith.
