The Administrative Board met in the church library at 4:30 p.m. with seven members present: Pastor Shirley, Deanna, JoLynne, Roger, Marilyn, Mark and Joan.

Shirley gave devotions from Psalms 55-63, "Bless the Lord, Oh My Soul".

Deanna brought the Ad Board meeting to order. The minutes were read; motion by Roger to approve minutes, 2nd by Marilyn; all in favor, motion passed.

Pastor's Report: Had three Sunday Church Services, five church bulletins, and two children's stories. Made

plans for the rummage sale and clean up. Attended Women of Faith meeting. Attended Seder supper by Kathy and a Tenebrae service on Good Friday night. JoLynne and I picked out graduation gifts and presented them. Fixed egg bake for Easter morning. Inquired about the little girls in the hospital; and followed up with two adult members after their

hospitalizations.

Worship: Kathy will do Memorial Day service. Senior party/luncheon will be held Wed., July 2.

Finance: The utility bill is much lower now that weather is warmer. Parsonage is booked for the rest

of the month. Have \$47,526.83 in Bank. Everything is going well.

Trustees: Removed old freezer out for City wide cleanup. Trustees will work on the pile of dirt where

sewer work was done - and will level off and re-seed as needed .

Teaching: Kathy is done with Sunday school. The adults will shut down in about two weeks.

Outreach: Had lots of help with rummage sale. Good crowd came on Friday, but not on Saturday, so

there are still good items left.

Nurturing: Had Muffins for Moms on Mother's Day. Will have treats for Dads next month.

Women of Faith: Had a really good meeting – seven people came. We want to continue but without the

current structure – will have no president; and will discuss what we want to do. Plan to have Senior party in July; and Cookie Plates for Christmas. Crittenden Home needs school supplies, etc. so will keep them in mind. Will visit nursing homes and continue with Easter

baskets, and will have lunch once a month plus will start sending birthday cards.

New Business: Discussed the condition of carpeting in the library and two church offices. JoLynne moved
