



Our Life Together


More crosses for the office walls.

Women of Faith: Had Muffins for Moms on Mother's Day and will have Donuts for Dads on Father's

Day. Started planning the senior party in July at the Women of Faith meeting.

Old Business: Valerie is our new contact with Marcus Lumber. She will come and measure office

rooms, and look at Fellowship Hall next week.

New Business: Front lawn of church needs work. Buschman Lawn & Landscape quoted \$484.11 to

add organic fertilizer, fescue grass seed, till the bare spots and fuel charges, and recommended doing this work in the fall. Their bid is only good for 30 days. JoLynne moved we approve the Buschman bid; 2nd by Mark; all in favor, motion carried.

Received letter from NCLL lawyers who helped us during disaffiliation, who want to keep a contract with us. JoLynne moved we reject NCLL's request for further

coverage; 2nd by Roger; all in favor, motion carried.

Request was received from member tasking to help a child go to Nebowa Christian Camp at Onawa this summer. Mark moved we accept the request from this member, put information in FOCUS and if others sign up, we will pay for them

to go as well; 2nd by Marilyn. All in favor, motion carried.

Mark will do devotions.

JoLynne moved we adjourn the meeting, 2nd by Marilyn; all in favor, motion passed.

Shirley ended the meeting with a prayer.
