Thoughts From the Desk of Shirley...

The past month, I had the opportunity to tune into a local TV station to watch their Sunday morning church service from a mega church. I went away from that program with the strong feeling of how much I love our church with our close-knit church family, the traditional music and mission work.

Our culture is obsessed with church size. Only about 1% of all churches can boast of 2,000 or more attendees, yet they get the lion's share of the publicity. How sad that 90% of small churches rarely get the attention of the public or their success in bringing people to Christ and the wonderful things that small churches accomplish.

Often small churches (under 200 people) wish they could raise their Sunday morning attendance and have more programs. But most small-town churches feel very successful if they can keep their doors open and meet their budget with a Sunday attendance of 25-40 people. The Anthon Community Methodist Church has been very blessed. For so many years, we had our share of struggles. Today, we are blessed. We have a consistent attendance and people who are dedicated to making our church successful.

90% of all churches have under a hundred attendees and any church with 200 attendees or less is considered a small church. There is a lot of diversity between a church of 20 and church of 200. A typical church has 100 attendees or less. It's not unusual for a small town like Anthon to have three or four churches, but we are doing what God has called us to do. If we look at what Jesus did to grow his following, we can look at a man who was a small seed, preaching to small crowds, leading his small group of disciples. Often disciples traveled two by two to spread the word of the Gospel. In the beginning, there was not an accumulation of disciples, not a mega group, but a small group. Theirs was not an easy life, but one fraught with danger and uncertainty.

Today, there is real strength in a small church. We can't compete with the mega churches with our shrinking economy, people moving in and out of communities, so we need to do what we have been called to do. We can't fix the size of our churches, but we can be in relationship with our church family and continue to do our mission work without worrying about growing our attendance or the size of our congregation. It's harder for people in a mega church to interact with each other simply because of the size and amount of people. Smaller churches lack the programs and therefore depend on the fellowship of each other and their mission work.

Large churches take a lot of planning to develop programs within their churches. They have to

Large churches take a lot of planning to develop programs within their churches. They have to deal with overhead, staff, and calendar events for each group, where small churches who lack the attendance depend on their people to implement changes or new ideas.

Are we being rated on how many baptisms we have, how many young people go through confirmation, how many programs we have in place? Or are we being recognized for the hundreds of pounds of clothing we have given to the Gospel Mission, the Orphan Grain Train, the coats we have given to the warming shelter and the money we have donated to so many organizations in need? There is an advantage to a smaller church family. We're there for each other. We're there to contribute to our mission programs. We're there to comfort each other when there is a death in the community. We're there to share fellowship with pot luck dinners. We are there to thank God for those who are involved with the church.

Thoughts From the Desk of Shirley continued..

We are able to engage in the community. We can show our love, take care of people, join in community activities. We can think in smaller pieces. We can be authentic and not apologetic for our Building, our attendance or for our preaching, it doesn't matter. What does matter is the kindness we show, the people we take care of, the comfort we bring, the love in our hearts. The smallness of our congregation is not an indicator of the successfulness of our church.

Since the covid virus hit in 2020 and so many people quit attending church, it became the hardest time to be a pastor and to lead a church, so instead of trying to grow the congregation, pastors have concentrated on the people they have in their church family. Blessings are what we have and what we do with what God has given us. Whether it's a mega church or a small church, we all have the same goal in mind....to be the best Christians we can be!

The Administrative Board met in the church library at 4:30 p.m. with seven members present: Pastor Shirley, Deanna, JoLynne, Roger, Marilyn, Mark and Joan.

Deanna gave devotions on "Indispensable Tools".

Deanna called the Ad-Board meeting to order. The minutes of the last meeting were read. JoLynne moved we accept the minutes; 2nd by Marilyn; all in favor, motion passed.

Pastor's Report: Busy month with so many in the hospital –made hospital visits on three different days. Made nursing home visit

to Mapleton. Also followed up on five who have been ill. Preached three Sundays. Tim and Kathy also preached a Sunday. Made trip to Marcus to pick up larger carpet samples. Worked with Roger and Mike Kerns to replace 18 light bulbs in fellowship hall and sanctuary. Had Women Of Faith meeting, mission and nurturing meeting regarding school supplies and upcoming mission project with warming shelter and Gospel Mission. Called both regarding when they would like coats, clothes and blankets. Membership meeting. New committee list coming

out soon. Had to reschedule membership portion of the meeting.

Worship: Want to keep Roger and Erin singing.

Finance: Going well with our assets.

Trustees: Lights were checked out. Frontage of church work will be done in October. Mark didn't hear back about the work

on south side of roof, so called someone else. Still waiting for a call-back. Gary & Marilyn fixed closet to hang banners over rods. Had an issue in the parsonage with smoke coming from lift chair remote, so had chair

removed. Also have problems with the vertical blinds being old & brittle – may need sheers or curtains.

Teaching: No meeting but will have Adults and high school meeting this week.

Missions: Sent a lot to Sioux City Crittenden Center – value \$195. In gathering kits shipping & handling went up from \$2

to \$3. Will see if Mapleton needs supplies. Took 20 kits there. Sent \$200 to Crittenden .

Nurturing: Nothing

SPRC: Discussed Shirley's raise. Jo moved we give Shirley a 5% raise, beginning next month; 2nd by Roger; all in favor,

motion passed.

JoLynne reported she is meeting with Nikki to get the books audited this next week.

Women of Faith: Met and talked about what we can do this year. Will have Easter baskets, Christmas baskets, will be making

fleece/tied blankets for missions. We will stay as a group.

Old Business: Discussed our insurance in detail. Will keep cyber insurance, cancel terrorism insurance but will add Workman's

Comp for our pastor.

Marilyn moved we raise our personal property insurance for the parsonage to \$15,000 up from \$12,000; 2nd by

Mark; all in favor, motion passed.

New Business: Will be having confirmation class.

Need to remove sink in library closet before carpet is laid. Roger will call a plumber to cap the drain and turn off

water.

Shirley ended the meeting with a prayer.
