Deanna brought the meeting to order. The minutes of the last meeting were read. Mark moved to accept the minutes with one correction; 2nd by Roger; all in favor, motion passed.

Pastor's Report: Sent cards and made calls. Kathy and I covered church services and bulletins. Had one funeral

> with prayer service the night before, committal service, and visits with family. Discussed serving soup every other month to our 22 shut-ins. Had only three services this month as church was

cancelled due to weather.

Had our hanging of the greens a week later with lunch after. Worship:

Finance: Finances are stable with a balance of \$53,155,62.

Trustees: Parsonage garage door seal has been purchased and will be installed this week. Started

> insulated stripping on front door cover. Snow was pushed around the church. Church exit lights need light bulbs so will purchase the correct ones. Fire extinguishers were inspected over a year ago so will check them too. Sign board key has broken inside the lock and will need to be

replaced; will have it checked out.

Teaching: Nothing to report.

Missions: Several loads of donated items including gloves and hats were taken to the Warming Shelter but

still have more to take. Will purchase more gloves as needed.

SPRC: Nothing to report.

Women of Faith: Will meet Thursday to firm up menu for shut-ins. Will send calendar with dates the food will be

delivered so we don't need to call everyone. Have 22 to feed now but looking for more. Will be

an ongoing project.

Old Business: Need to get carpet in offices and library installed.

Kathy's Sunday school room needs new carpet. We need to get audit done next month. **New Business:**

Church cancellation due to weather will now be put on TV.

Marilyn moved we purchase Visa gift cards for Christmas this year; 2nd by Roger; all in favor,

motion passed.


